Overview of policing in England and Wales

Devolved in Scotland and Northern Ireland

- 43 territorial forces across England and Wales – managed by the Home Office.
- Handful of specialist forces, such as British Transport Police, Civil Nuclear Constabulary – managed separately.
- Police and Crime Commissioners (PCCs)



Spending Review 2010

- HM Treasury-spending department relationship
- Followed financial crisis in 2008/09
- Cuts to all public services
- Projected Home Office overview:



- Savings from IT, procurement and back office functions






POLICE OFFICER STRENGTH, FTE AT 31 MARCH including long-term absentees, England and Wales

Spending Review 2015






SR15 headlines:

- Police funding protected importance of external events


SR15: Police funding profile
