Policy recommendation backed by evidence





Average PISA scores in mathematics and reading, 2015



- ✓ The Roma scores gap of 150 points corresponds to more than 5 years of schooling
- This significantly higher even compare to disadvantage groups in other countries




#### Mean PIAAC proficiency scores by home language




#### Age pyramid

- Non-integration scenario holds the Roma labour market outcomes constant at the current level




## **Estimated effects of integration costs in terms of**
